Community-Based Health Services

Community Health Services Program provides community-based health services intended to support persons with acute or chronic illnesses or physical disabilities to remain at home as independently as possible. Services are offered by interdisciplinary Health Teams which consist of the following services:

Case Management

Services include assessment, consultations, referrals, and monitoring. Case Managers, in the community and hospitals, coordinate a variety of services to assist people to live at home independently and safely. These include subsidized home support service, caregiver relief (Respite) available in facility or home, and adult day programs. Facility placement and admission to Assisted Living are also arranged when required.

Community Nursing

Services include assessment, treatment, teaching health promotion, coordination of services, remote health monitoring services and end of life care in collaboration with the Victoria Hospice Program.

Remote health monitoring service is a free service to support people living with chronic disease: heart failure, diabetes, and COPD. We help manage health from the comfort of their home and provide education and self-management support to eligible clients, families, and caregivers. The monitoring program is approximately 12 weeks. By participating in this service, clients will improve their knowledge of chronic disease and ability to manage their own health. Discuss this program with your Physician or contact Island Health (South) Community Health Services, Community Access Line above to ask about eligibility.

Home Support Services

Individuals with home-based needs for personal care such as bathing, dressing, toileting, and medication administration may be eligible for subsidized home support.

Nutrition

Provides a continuum of clinical nutritional services for homebound persons in order to maintain optimum client health.

Rehabilitation

Services include physiotherapy and occupational therapy, assessment, perceptual and cognitive testing, treatment, consultation, and education. Recreation therapy services are provided individually and in group settings.

Social Work

Support of community health services clients, their families, caregivers and/or friends to resolve, prevent or lessen the impact of psychological, spiritual, physical, and mental health related issues. Social workers are also delegated to respond to issues of neglect and abuse.

Respite Care

Respite Care program serves those 55 and over who are medically stable. **The Piercy Respite Hotel** offers spacious, private rooms for 24-hour respite. Care receivers can reside at the hotel for 1 to 35 days, while their family caregivers plan a scheduled break from caregiving responsibilities. Urgent and Primary Care Centres

A UPCC provides team-based care for non-emergency health concerns. Offers same-day care for concerns such as minor injuries, sprains and strains, infections, less serious child illness and injury, high fever, asthma attacks, and cuts, wounds, or skin conditions. Patients who require medical attention within 12 - 24 hours but are not emergent. Physician referral, self-scheduled appointments and walk-in accepted. For life-threatening illnesses or injuries call 9-1-1 or go to the emergency department to be assessed and treated immediately.
